



Decommodifying EU policy changes:

Temporary suspension of EU fiscal pact

EU funds for healthcare infrastructure (not staff)

EU Directives: pay transparency, adequate minimum wages, sustainability, platform work

Commodifying EU interventions:

Country-specific EU prescriptions: marketisation of public services (including healthcare)

EU Regulation: promoting e-health for the creation of an EU healthcare market

May 2025: Ruling on Minimum wage directive

Decommodifying EU policy changes:

New suspension of EU fiscal pact (for re-arming Europe; not social infrastructure & staff?)

EU laws on "just transition", "stress at work", "minimum staffing levels in hospitals"?

Commodifying EU interventions:

Curtailing social cohesion and healthcare funding

Promoting EU healthcare "market"

Forthcoming EU Court judgment on Minimum Wage Directive:

"Workers will not understand why business-friendly EU governance prescriptions on wage cuts are legal while a labour-friendly directive on adequate minimum wages is not"

Transnational Social Protest does matters
